On Monday, March 25th Regency on Whidbey held its first ever attendance award party. Since Covid, attendance at Activities has declined considerably. In an effort to boost attendance, a punch-card program was implemented in February. The cards are kept in a file-box in the Activity Room to make the program as easy as possible for Residents. Staff takes attendance at all weekday events, except the movie & scenic drive, and the cards are then punched to track individual Resident's attendance. Once a Resident fills their card, 20 punches, they become eligible for a special "award" activity. The cards carry over from month to month, so even if it takes three months to fill, a Resident should still be able to attend eventually. It was decided to begin the program with a pizza party, but future award parties could include an ice cream outing, special restaurant trip, a home-cooked lunch, or some other special event. Our first group of attendance super-stars thoroughly enjoyed the pizza party complete with salad, beer and wine.
