DUTIES OF A CNA

- Take & record vital signs
- Answer call lights and handle requests
- Assist with ambulation, turning, repositioning
- Communicate resident information to team members
- Observe patients & report to nurses
- Document patient status & information
- Help with activities and outings
- Keep resident rooms clean
- Assist nursing with medical procedures
- Assist with activities of daily living: bathing, dressing, eating, etc.
- Know emergency procedures & safety policies
