Our Resident of the Month for February 2025 is Mary Steel. She was born at home in Mill Valley, CA, during the time before the Golden Gate Bridge was built. Her father, a Bay Area native, was a businessman who manufactured and sold fruit and berry baskets made of wood and metal. Her mother was from England. Her parents happened to live in the same building and met each other over needing to borrow a pan for a party. Mary's childhood was different than most. The nearest elementary school was 21 miles away and there was no bus. She lived in a remote area of California at the time, in northern Mendocino County. Needing a solution and wanting Mary to have friends she would keep throughout her school years, her parents found foster families for her to live with near the closest high school district - 70 miles away in Ukiah. Mary lived away from her parents during the school year, with 5 different families, for 8 years. Her mother would come to visit her while she was away at school.

Mary graduated from Ukiah High School in 1946. She attended college at U.C. Berkeley and graduated with a B.S. in history. After graduation, Mary worked at the Emporium store on Market Street in San Francisco. In those days, everyone went to San Francisco to go shopping. Mary had an advantage in that she had a college degree, and she easily got a job as a supervisor. She lived in Berkeley and commuted to work in S.F.

On weekends, Mary and her friends played tennis. She met her husband, Geoffrey, on the tennis courts through mutual friends. He was waiting to see if he passed the bar exam. Somehow or another, they exchanged phone numbers and were married about 2 years later. (*Continued on pg. 2*)

**1995:** American businessman Steve Fossett completes the first solo flight across the Pacific Ocean in a balloon.

**2006:** At the Winter Olympics in Italy, U.S. speedskater Shani Davis becomes the first black athlete to win an individual gold medal in Winter Games history.

**2011:** "The Artist" wins the Oscar for best picture. It was the first silent film to win the award since "Wings" in 1927.

**2014:** Comedian Jimmy Fallon becomes the host of the late-night talk show "The Tonight Show."
