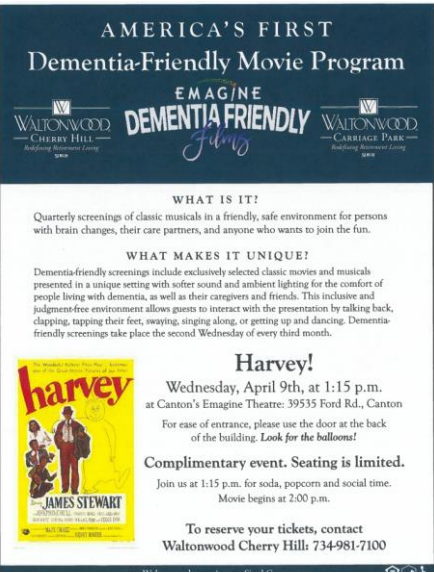
18th Read Across America:
