Our June Resident of the Month is Lou Bacigalup. He lives at Ponté Palmero with his beloved 16-year-old cat, Riley. He was born in Salt Lake City, Utah, but he grew up on the beaches of Santa Monica in Southern California. Lou is the youngest of 3 sons. He was a gymnast in high school, competing against other schools on the rings and the parallel bars. He joined the army when he was 18 and went overseas to the Philippines during the last 6 months of WWII. During that time he remembers traveling to Japan, where he and a group of soldiers climbed Mt. Fuji on the 4th of July.

After the military, Lou went to night school to learn tool and die design. He had a brother-in-law in the wire and cable business. He worked with his brother-in-law for a while and then started his own business. Over the years, Lou owned several companies, including one which helped develop the air to ground missiles the military uses today. Lou was in business for about 12 years. After that, he sold his companies and retired to a redwood cabin in the mountains above Santa Cruz, CA.

Lou has a daughter and 2 sons. His daughter works in real estate in Key West, Florida. She has a knack for fixing up old buildings, getting them ready for sale. One of his sons is a boat builder in Stuart, FL, and the other is C.F.O. of a healthcare company in Hawaii. Lou visits with his children about once a year.

During retirement, Lou used to spend winters in Mexico. He met his wife Lorraine while living there. They happened to be next door neighbors. They lived in a small village called Mulegé in Baja California, known for its fishing. Lorraine was a veterinarian. She had a small animal clinic.

She and Lou helped spay and neuter the stray dogs in the town as a service to the community. While living in Mexico, Lou and Lorraine experienced flooding twice. They decided to move back to California to Swansboro, where Lorraine owned a home.

When Lou was a young man, he used to rebuild early V8 Fords for street racing. Growing up in Santa Monica, he surfed, but his real love was sailing! When he lived in Santa Cruz, he had a sailboat in the harbor, and he used to go sailing every weekend. Sailing wasn't "just a hobby" for Lou. He and his crew (his 2 sons) competed in sailboat races along the California coast, including the world's largest sailboat race. In this particular race, 600 boats launch at noon from Newport Beach, CA and finish 24 hours later in Ensenada, Baja California, Mexico. He and his sons competed 10 times and placed 4th in class twice (See top photo, right hand column.). Later in life, Lou liked to build radio-controlled model sailboats, about 3 feet long. He was also a woodworker, making furniture, boats and canoes.

1789: James Madison proposes the Bill of Rights, leading to

the Constitution's first 10 amendments.

1865: Union General Granger reaches Galveston, Texas, one of the last holdouts of slavery, and enforces the Emancipation Proclamation for enslaved people there.

1919: The Treaty of Versailles is signed in France, signaling the official end of World War I.

1947: Pilot Kenneth Arnold reports flashes of light and nine incredibly speedy "saucer-like" UFOs whizzing over Mount Rainier, Wash., leading to the common term "flying saucers."

1956: President Eisenhower signs a bill funding interstate highway building, making it the largest American public works program.
