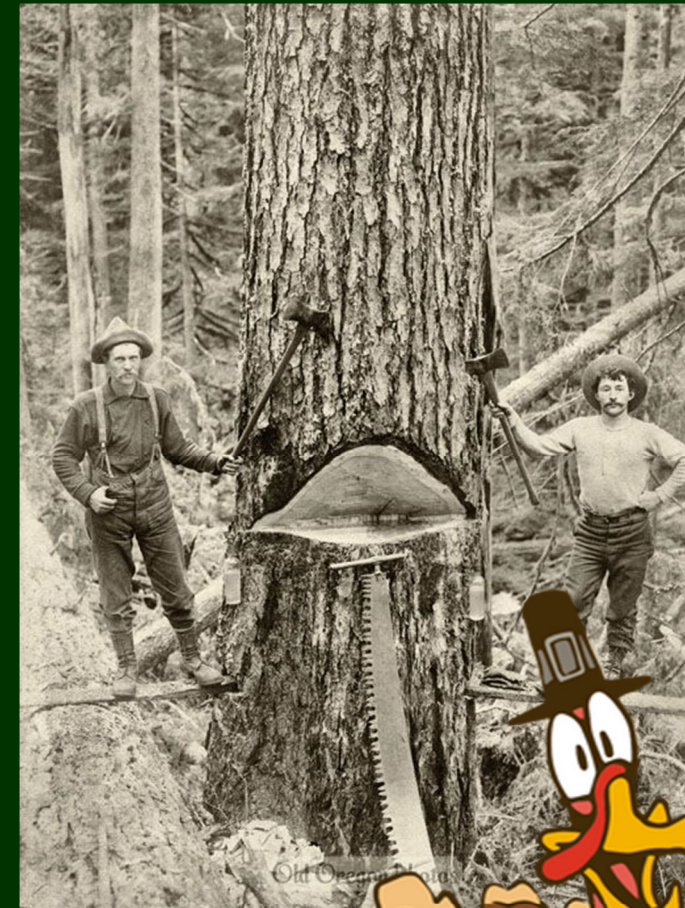

# Thanksgiving Day Activities:

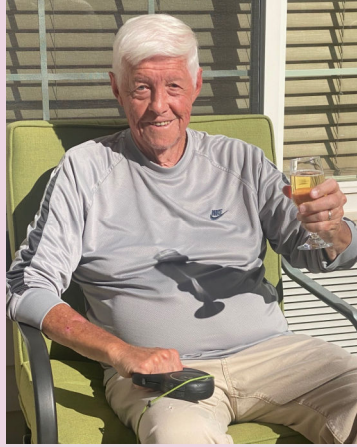


**From 10:00 to 2:00, a simple Holiday Craft Project** will be set up in the Fireside Room. Residents, Staff and Guests are invited to be creative!

**On the cover:** The timber industry in Oregon grew alongside the California Gold Rush of the 1800s. As more white settlers moved west hoping to strike it rich, the need for lumber increased. When rail lines were extended into Oregon in the 1870-80s, the Ponderosa Pines of Eastern Oregon and the forested areas of the Western Cascades were there to meet the need. Between the 1880s and 1911, more railways were added and logging boomed. By 1938, Oregon was the nation's leading producer of wood. To this day, Oregon produces more wood building materials than any other state.

# Resident Spotlight on Leon Hayes



Leon has been in Oregon all his life. Born in Eugene but grew up in Cottage Grove which was a small logging town back in the day, with a population of 500 people. That is where he began working for the logging mill in the summers. He got to travel working for the mills and the longest trip he took was from Oregon to North Carolina. Before Leon worked in the logging mills his father took him out hunting. He says he will never forget when he shot his first buck at just 12 years old.

The school that Leon attended had less than 200 students. That is where he met his high school sweetheart in algebra class and they got married just two years after their graduation. Leon attended Oregon University in Eugene with an athletic scholarship majoring in Physical Education and minoring in health. Leon played college basketball and baseball. He was awarded *Most Valuable Team Player* and was elected to the *Sports Hall of Fame*. He made the newspaper a few times for his athletic achievements. His most memorable athletic achievement was his final game going up against Oregon State basketball in Corvallis. Leon's team was in the lead, and they won by four points which lead them to the NCA. After college Leon settled down in Cottage Grove with his wife and kids. He took a job teaching biology, PE, and health.

# Fox Hollow WILD Turkey Hunt!

Benjamin Franklin called the Turkey, “A bird of courage.” While the suggestion that he advocated for the Turkey to be our national bird is a myth, he wrote that the Turkey was “A much more respectable bird, and withal a true original Native American.” Turkey became the traditional main dish on Thanksgiving Day in the 19th century because wild turkeys were plentiful in North America and in 1863 after Abraham Lincoln declared Thanksgiving Day a national holiday, writers and artists started depicting a big roasted turkey on holiday tables.

It so happens that wild turkeys are **not** native to Oregon but were introduced to The Beaver State in the early 1960s. Never-the-less, wild turkeys are plentiful here in Deschutes County, so we're going to hunt them! 'Tis the season, right? There are 12 wild turkeys (figuratively) hiding somewhere in all of the beautiful photos of Oregon's landscapes and landmarks represented in the 100 framed prints hanging all over the building. Each week in November, starting on Monday, the 3rd, several clues to the whereabouts of a wild turkey will be posted on the Activity Room doors. You will not know when new clues are posted, because these turkeys are WILD! So stop by frequently to see if new clues have been posted. The photos will be numbered, with a small sticker in the lower right corner of each framed print. The first person to locate the correct photo number will be the **Turkey-Sharp-Shooter** for that Turkey. That hunter will get his/her picture taken with their turkey and their name will be put in a drawing for a special Thanksgiving Day prize.

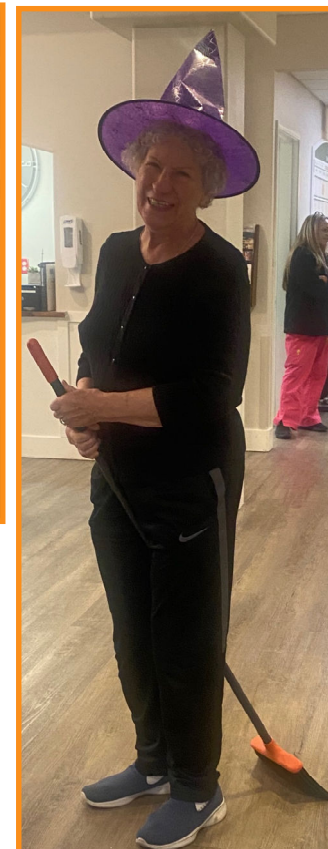
**God's Bible Study with Jim**
