Regency on Whidbey Celebrates Our Veterans

On Monday, November 10th, Regency on Whidbey's Assisted Living building held its annual Veterans Day Ceremony in the Assisted Living Dining Room immediately after lunch. The event began with the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by the presentation of the POW/MIA table by George Lawson, a long-time friend of Regency. Executive Director, Wilma Jo Flaherty, then said a few words and read the patriotic poem With Praise for Aging Veterans by Reverend Greg Asimakoupoulos. Our speaker this year was Steppe Williford an Air Force Veteran who is now the archivist for the local PBY Museum. Steppe recalled his time stationed in Iceland, witnessing the return of POWs from Vietnam as they stopped at the base there on their way home to the States following their release. He also shared some of the life-lessons that the military had taught him. Following his talk, our Veterans were recognized with a certificate of appreciation for their service. At Regency on Whidbey about 22 percent of our Residents are Veterans. Once we add in the spouses of Veterans, the percentage of Residents with a military connection rises to about 65 percent. It is for this reason that Regency on Whidbey always honors the Spouses of Veterans with a special Military Spouse reading and a single rose. This year's Ceremony was closed with a prayer offered by one of our Residents, Bob Burke, a Navy Veteran.

On Veterans Day, Residents in Memory Care were honored for their service, while Assisted Living Residents attended the Veterans Day Ceremony at Oak Harbor High School. In the afternoon, Residents from both buildings hit the road, riding on our bus for the Veterans Day Parade. Thank you to all our Veterans, past and present, and the families who support them.



It is very important that you signout when leaving the building and remember to sign-in upon your return. Why? Residents are monitored throughout the day, particularly at meal time. If caregivers cannot find you, the search is broadened. Staff will begin to check other areas of the building and the surrounding area. If you are still not found, Staff will get in their private vehicles and drive out into the community looking for you. As this is happening, Nursing Staff will begin to reach-out to your family members, and if they are not available, the police will be contacted to issue a "Silver Alert."

If you simply do your part, it will save our Staff and local law enforcement a lot of effort.


