

Resident of the Month: Ray LeVitt

Our resident of the month for December is Ray LeVitt. He has lived at Ponté for 17 months. Ray was born in Placerville, CA, and grew up in mining towns near Gerlach, Nevada, Mammoth Lakes, and Bishop, CA. His father was a civil engineer and his mother was a homemaker, a blackjack dealer, and a legal secretary. Ray met his first wife on a tour of California. They had a daughter, Rachel, and a son, Nathan, before parting ways.

Ray met his late wife, Marcia, at an H&R Block tax preparation class in Sacramento. They both worked for Sacramento County: Marcia in the Welfare Fraud unit and Ray as chief of the utilities billing and customer service division of the Public Works Agency. After 7 years, they moved to Coloma, where they spent 30 years making their house and 10 acres beautiful. During their time off, they travelled extensively, including visiting ghost towns all over Nevada. In 2009, the couple retired and took a 3 month RV trip through Western Canada and Alaska, and another 3 month trip across the U.S. and Eastern Canada. Ray also spent 15 years as a trustee of the Kelsey Pioneer Cemetery.

In 2024, Marcia and Ray came to Ponté as they were aging and needing more assistance. The acreage was more than they could handle any longer. Unfortunately, Ray lost Marcia during the move. He is coping thanks to meeting new friends at Ponté and continuing relationships with friends back in Coloma and Garden Valley. Keeping busy has helped Ray. "This Month In History"

DECEMBER

1907: On New Year's Eve, a ball decorated with 100 lightbulbs is lowered down a flagpole over New York City's Times Square. The ball drop has been featured in the annual celebration ever since.

1918: In the first official visit by a U.S. president to Europe, Woodrow Wilson travels to France for World War I peace negotiations.

1924: Astronomer Edwin Hubble announces his discovery of the existence of galaxies outside the Milky Way. The Hubble Space Telescope was named in his honor.

1941: America enters World War II after the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, Hawaii.

1966: The first observance of Kwanzaa takes place in Los Angeles. The seven-day holiday celebrates African heritage.

1970: Congress authorizes the creation of a new dollar coin depicting President Dwight D. Eisenhower.

1982: Gabriel Garcia Marquez is awarded the Nobel Prize in

literature. The Colombian writer is best known for his 1967 novel "One Hundred Years of Solitude."

1990: British computer scientist Tim Berners-Lee demonstrates his information-sharing system that would become the World Wide Web.

2001: Italy's Leaning Tower of Pisa reopens to the public after 11 years and \$27 million in work to fortify its famous lean.

2017: "Star Wars: The Last Jedi," the eighth installment in the space fantasy series, premieres. The film's \$1 billion in ticket sales made it the year's highest-grossing film.
